At the crossroads...

For centuries, pilgrims on their way to Santiago de Compostela, major place of pilgrimage, have followed the *Via Podiensis* and stopped by Moissac Abbey, a site included on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

Beyond the green valley of the Lot, the Quercy region is the Tarn-et-Garonne's front door to Santiago. The way to Compostela is the invisible link connecting Lauzerte, Moissac and Auvillar: thousands of pilgrims are setting foot on this territory made of hills and plains, where the rivers Tarn and Garonne join each other and meet the Canal des Deux-Mers (Canal of the Two Seas).

Beyond the *Via Podiensis*, this map invites you to discover more widely this land of plenty where charming villages, markets and local gastronomy are great opportunities to come and spend a weekend or more...

Welcome to Deux Rives!

Located in the heart of the South-West, at the borders of the departments of Tarn-et-Garonne, Lot-et-Garonne and Gers, our region, a major site in Occitanie, is crossed by the Garonne river and by the Canal des Deux-Mers. It serves as a true bridge between Occitanie and Nouvelle Aquitaine. Let yourself be captivated by this generous and authentic land, be charmed by our beautiful villages with their remarkable heritage and be seduced by our variety of landscapes.



AUVILLAR, ONE OF THE « MOST BEAUTIFUL VILLAGES IN FRANCE »

Auvillar, a stopover on the way to Santiago de Compostela, is easily identified by its surprising circular grain market in the heart of the village. A warm and distinctive atmosphere emanates from the traditional houses, made of a mixture of red bricks and white stones. This former Gallo-Roman city reached its golden age thanks to earthenware and goose quill pen industries. Besides the Place de la Halle, take the time to wander through the streets to admire the Clock Tower, the church, the Place du Château with its viewpoint over the Garonne river, the Rue des Nobles, the ancient wash house, and go down to the old port to admire the Sainte-Catherine chapel. Don't forget to discover the art and craft galleries, the exhibition at the Tourist Office, the Vieil Auvillar museum, and have a break in one of the many restaurants of this lovely village. Every Sunday morning, local producers are waiting for you on the square for the traditional market.



VALENCE D'AGEN

13th-century bastide. Be sure to see its three wash houses, its covered market halls, its dovecote, its port, its markets on Tuesday and Saturday mornings and don't miss the walks along the Canal des Deux-Mers.



DUNES

Dunes, a 13th-century bastide, is built around the old central covered market. Discover the old weavers' district, the Place des Martyrs and the half-timbered houses. In the town hall lobby, discover the history of the hanged men during the Second World War and the archaeological collection resulting from the excavations of the Tour des Templiers (Templars' Tower).

WALKS AROUND THE DEUX RIVES

The area offers 20 hiking trails and is crossed by the GR65, the route to Santiago de Compostela. Set off and explore this iconic route along the stage linking Moissac to Auvillar, and then Saint-Antoine. If you prefer cycling, explore the greenway along the Canal des Deux-Mers. In Valence d'Agén, on the greenway, you can also set off on one of the 4 signposted bike trails to discover the Deux Rives area at your own pace.



MONTJOI

Montjoi is a 13th-century hilltop bastide overlooking the Séoune valley. You can follow the ramparts walk to discover the village, enjoy the panoramic view from the viewing table, wander the narrow streets and admire the beautiful half-timbered houses. And feel free to step into the art gallery!



A PARADISE FOR MOTOR HOME ENTHUSIASTS

Most villages offer perfect conditions for motor-homes to stop. There are small, well-secured parking areas in the heart of the villages where motorhomes are welcome! In Valence d'Agén, there is also a municipal campsite close to the public summer swimming pool.

UNUSUAL: THE OAK OF HENRI IV

The oak tree in Merles is a real curiosity: gigantic and of a venerable age. Indeed, on the 10th of July 1579, Henri de Navarre, escorted by 44 horsemen and accompanied by Queen Margot, his wife, and by a party of elegant ladies and gentlemen, stopped in the shade of this oak tree. The story of the gigantic meal he had the day before is told just a few metres from this centuries-old tree.

STROLL AROUND THE MARKET

Tuesday morning is market day in Valence d'Agén, and it has been so since the creation of the bastide in 1283. In a colourful atmosphere, the appetizing smells mingle with the ambient cheerfulness. All the local products are present: sun-drenched fruits and vegetables from the Garonne valley, free-range chickens, local charcuterie... and, of course, the stars of the South-West's good living: duck confit and foie gras! Every Saturday morning, a farmers' market is held under the hall of the Place Nationale.



SAINT-ANTOINE DE PONT D'ARRATZ

Located at the entrance of the Gers department, the village is a stopover on the way to Santiago de Compostela. The old and impressive commandery is the evidence of the presence of the Antonines who have resided in the village for more than 600 years. The ancient city gate leads to the heart of the medieval town and to the church with its four-lobed Romanesque portal: a pure marvel!



CASTELSAGRAT

This 13th-century bastide is worth exploring for its 14th-century covered walkways surrounding the square, its 14th-century church and its magnificent altarpiece coming from the chapel of Saint Raymond college in Toulouse. Castelsagrat was built according to a geometric plan typical of bastides: a fortified church, a central square with a well, surrounded by arcades.
